



Share of public rental in total housing stock (2006-2009)




Commodification of housing in Poland




All this features make the housing not a right but a merit.

... at the same time housing policy is not universal




Habitat Poland advocacy position on housing

- 4. Based on model practices




Social Rental Agency by Habitat Poland

self-reliance is a main criterium




Social Rental Managers

SRM A social integration

providing information on private, social, public providers giving direction to specific organizations and contacts shaping solutions

SRM B employment services – specialized on individual career counseling, coaching, mentoring

SRM C employement services – job hunting, job matching services, regular contact with several employers

Housing niche for SRA

- temporarily available municipal stock
- private rental sector: offer addressed to inactive or sociallyconscious landlords
- Project-oriented funding: National Housing Fund, European Social Fund
