Dutch welfare policies

- 2015: WMO
- Shift in responsibilities (Duyvendak & Tonkens, 2018)
- Aim for the active citizen through self sufficiency (Newman & Tonkens, 2011)
 - As accessibility tool
 - As goal in trajectories
- Private issues vs. Public issues (Dewey, 1927)



Homelessness and welfare provisions

- Welfare provisions
 - Accessibility with self sufficiency matrix and local connection
- Increase in people experiencing homelessness
- Increase of waiting lists
- Discussion on the use of self sufficiency



Impact of corona measures





Changes in welfare policies

- Day activity centers closed
- Maintaining 1.5 meter distance
- Increase in shelter beds
 - > Access for everybody experiencing homelessness
- Public issue vs. private issue
 - Measures and opening/closing of shelters
 - Vaccination program









Effect of temporary policy change

- Limited infections with homeless population
- Temporary shelter had positive effect on users
 - Increasing of worries about finances
 - Change in provided support
- Change caused discussion: `why wasn't this possible before?'



Post corona policy ambitions

Focus on:

- Early signaling and intervention
- Prevention through other domains
- Decrease new influx or relapse
- Increase housing options



Motivation

- Report by the Council of Public Health & Society (2020)
 - Recovery starts with a house
 - Long term political dedication
 - Use the right to housing
 - Halting self sufficiency criterium
 - Prevent homelessness



Influence of crisis

- Influence on process and creation of new challenges
- Opening of new opportunities

Not corona crisis but early discussion is source for long term plans



Influence on crisis

- Does it really influence policy?
 - Care problem or housing problem
 - Public vs. private issue
 - Different terminology, same meaning?
