

HOWELESSNESS IN PORTUGAL IN BRIEF

- 31 Dec. 2021 9 604 were reported homeless in PORTUGAL
- **0.97** %
- 277 Participations of CLAS ou NPISA of 278 mainland counties (99,6%).
- Authonomous Regions –
 Require further attention

HOMELESSNESS IN PORTUGAL IN BRIEF

- (68%) are men transversal to all regions
- 1/3 from 45 to 64 anos (37%).
- Under 18 anos (22%)
- Civil status of almost $\frac{1}{4}$ of those in homelessness situations is unknown
- 61% are single
- 23% married/ couples
- 90% are Portuguese

NEW PROJECTS: STATE SUPPORTED

- NPISAS 2017/2022 20 NPISAS em 2019/34 em 2022
 - Housing First 11 + 8 = 19 Protocols \tilde{N} =600 people
- Shared Housing 25 + 24 = 49
 - 68 protocols for teams
 - Regional Efforts 33 projects for local teams



THE SOCIO-POLITICAL CONTEXT

- National strategy on homelessness since 2009
- Participation of civic society organizations and public entities

Active Participation in all stages of the strategy has been ensured by the meaningful Community-Based Organizations and Network Organizations supported by the PR Ministry of Social Welfare

- Formally appointed by ministerial resolution in 2017 with a mandate until 2023.
 - 2019 Present Experimental Training Sessions
- 2020 Online Training Sessions Baseline 250 professionals directly working with people with homelessness experiences.





Descriptive Analysis – N=40

Rediscovered Capacities/Interests - (n=13)

- Renovating interest in studying
- Opportunity to think about teamwork
- Increased resilience Capabilities
- The importance of strength over deficit

Validation/Acknowledgement of work, practices and beliefs (n=8)

- Fostered trust in their own work
- Feeling that we are not alone
- Valuing small wins
- Sense of being able of doing more and better
- Opportunity to reflect on our practices

Deepening or acquiring new competêncies – (n=4)

- Value tools sharing
- Knowledge about change processes
- Focus on solutions

Did not rediscover potentials (n=1)

• Did not rediscover potencials initial professional path.


