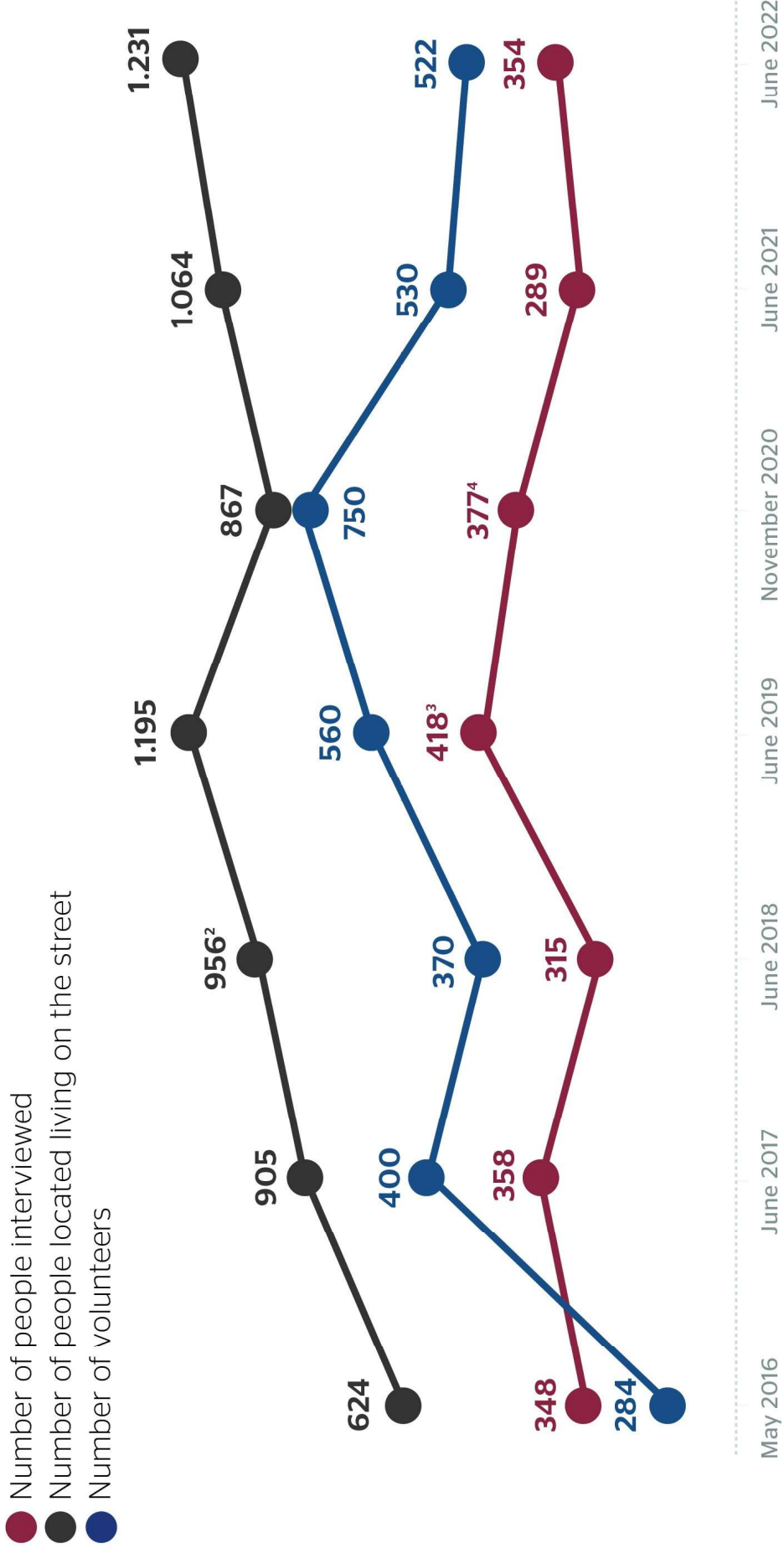

All surveys , evolution 2016-2022



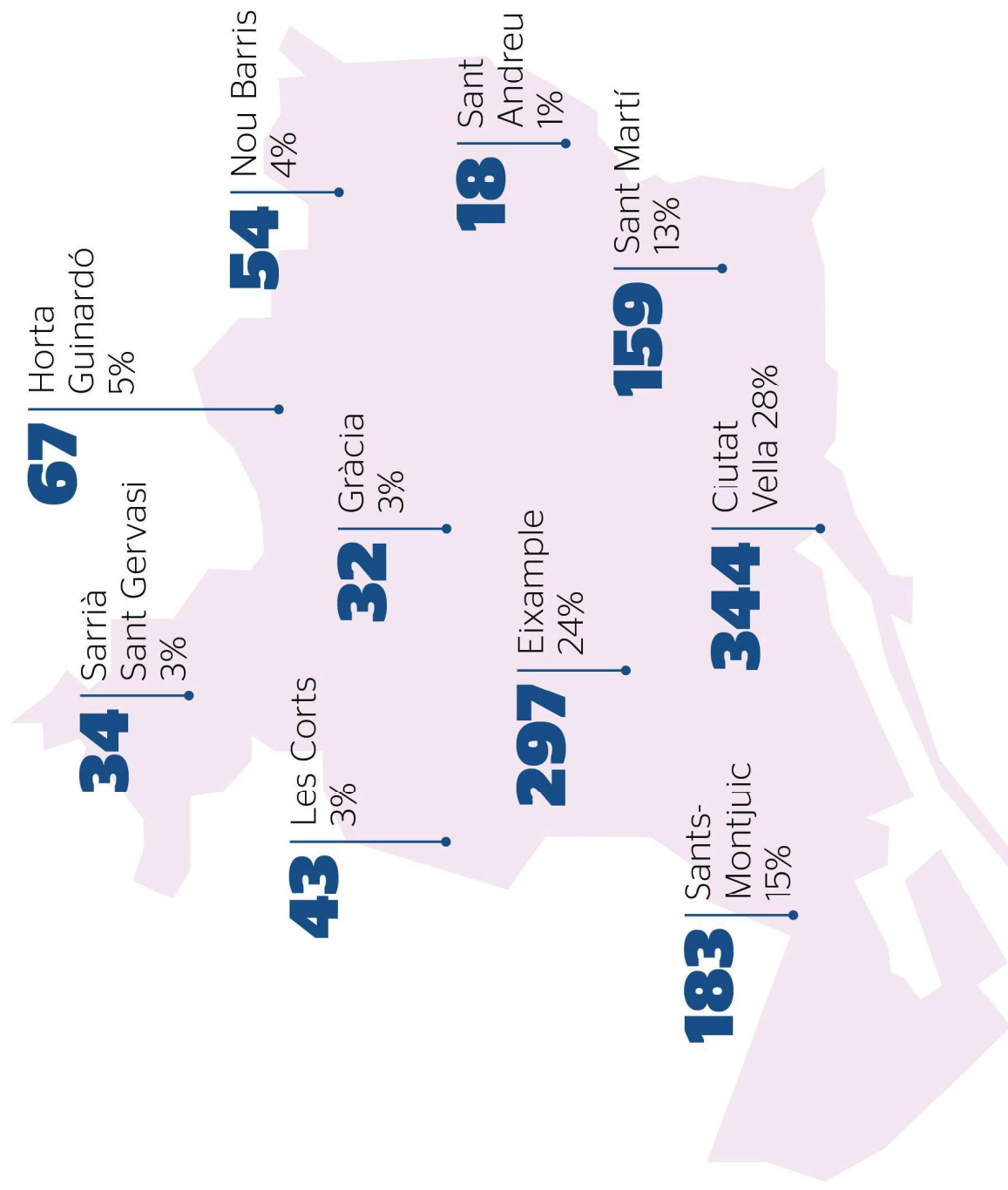

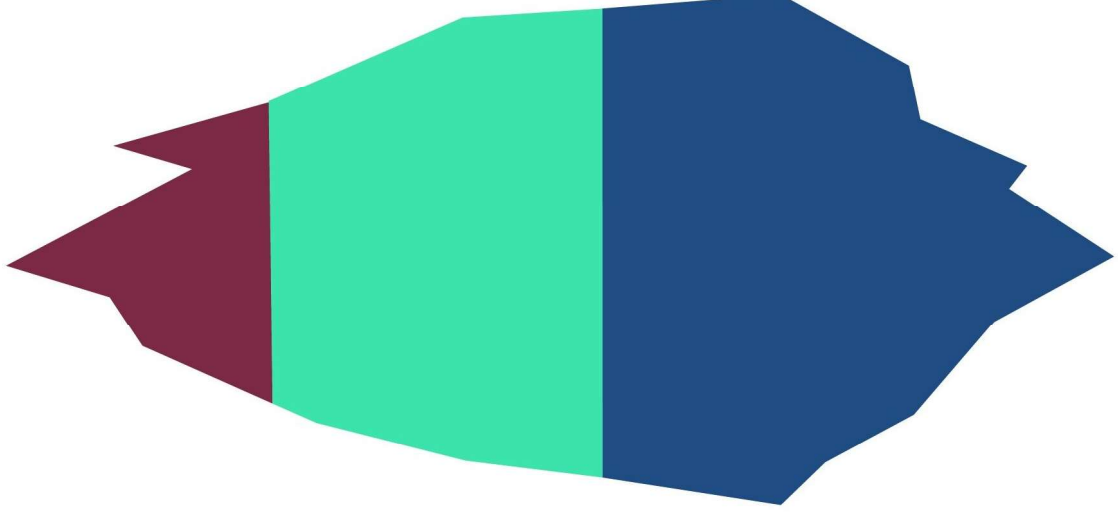

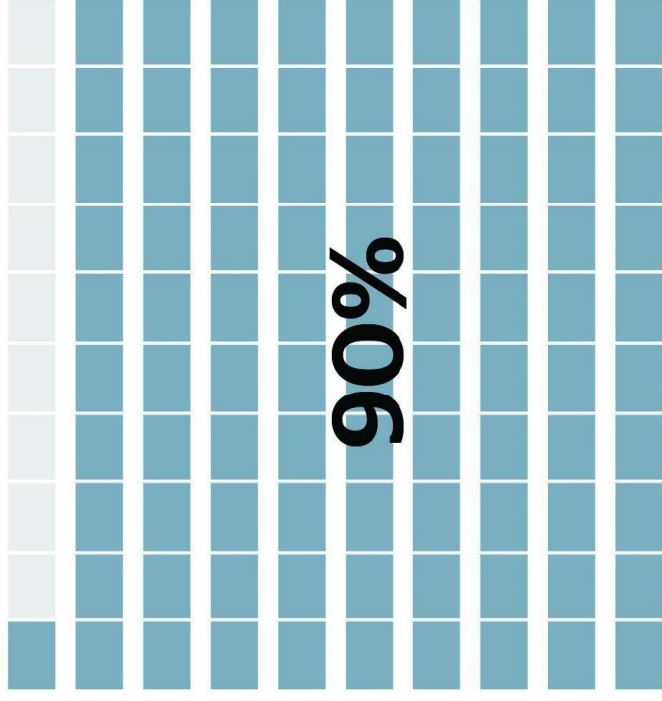

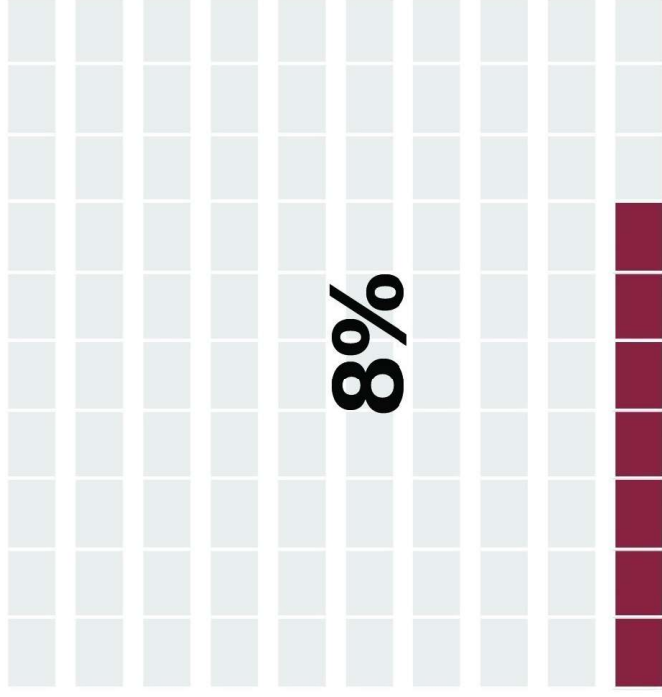

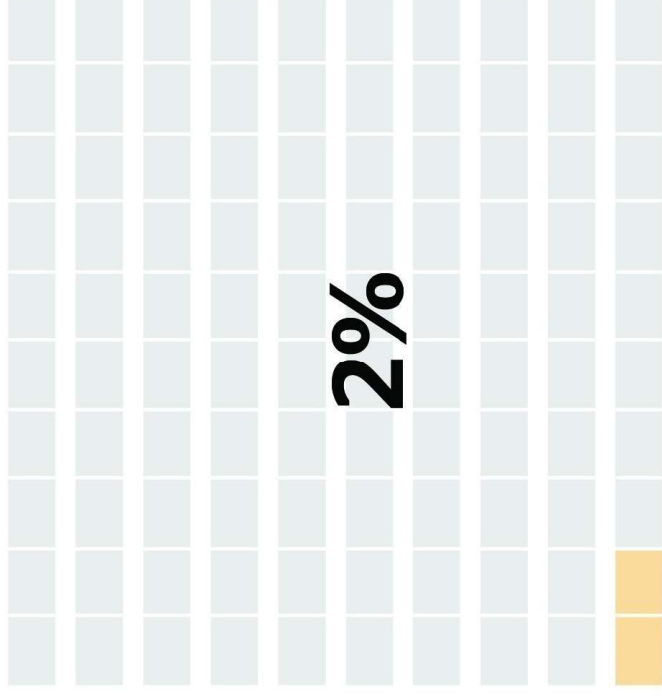

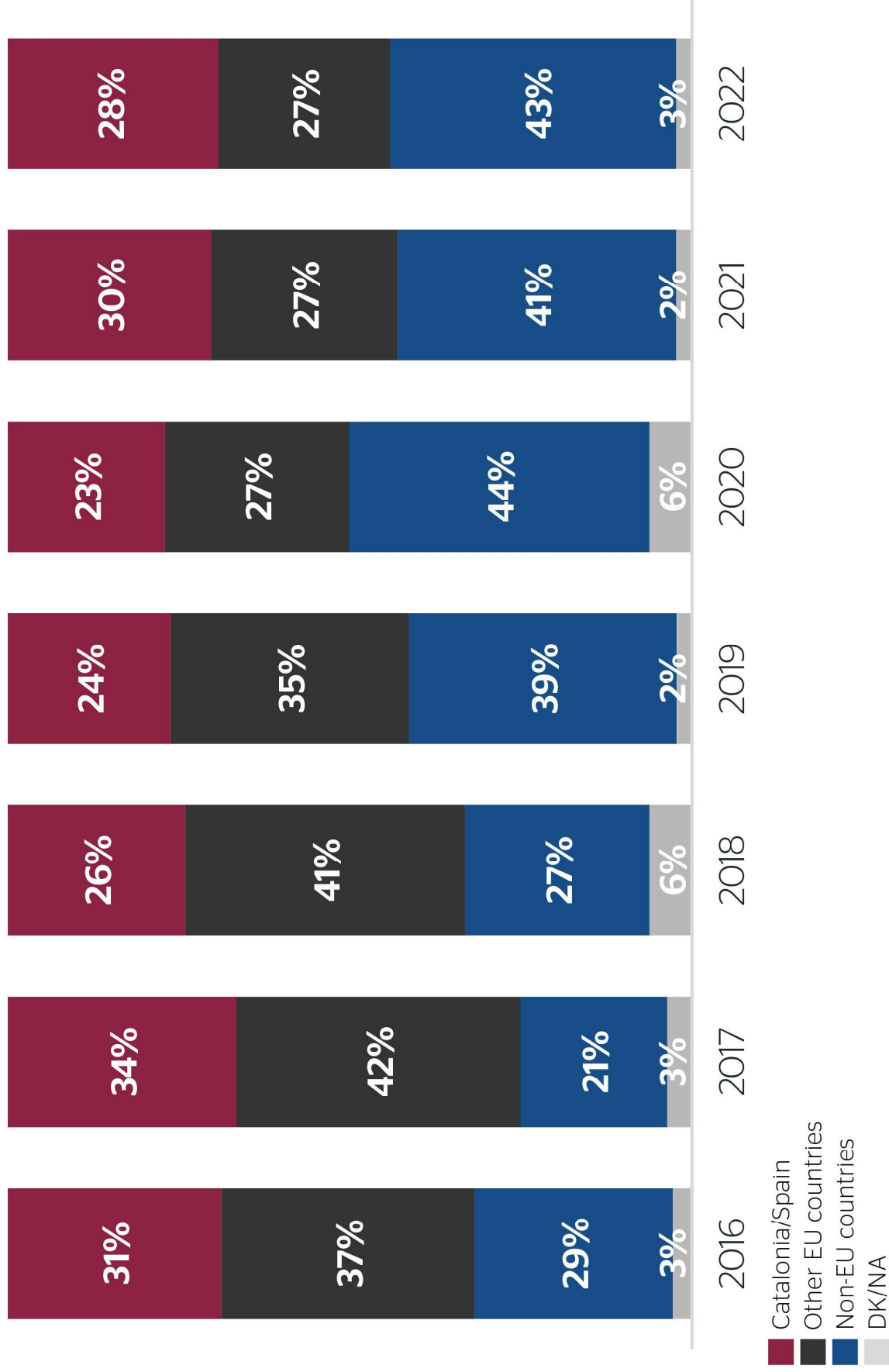

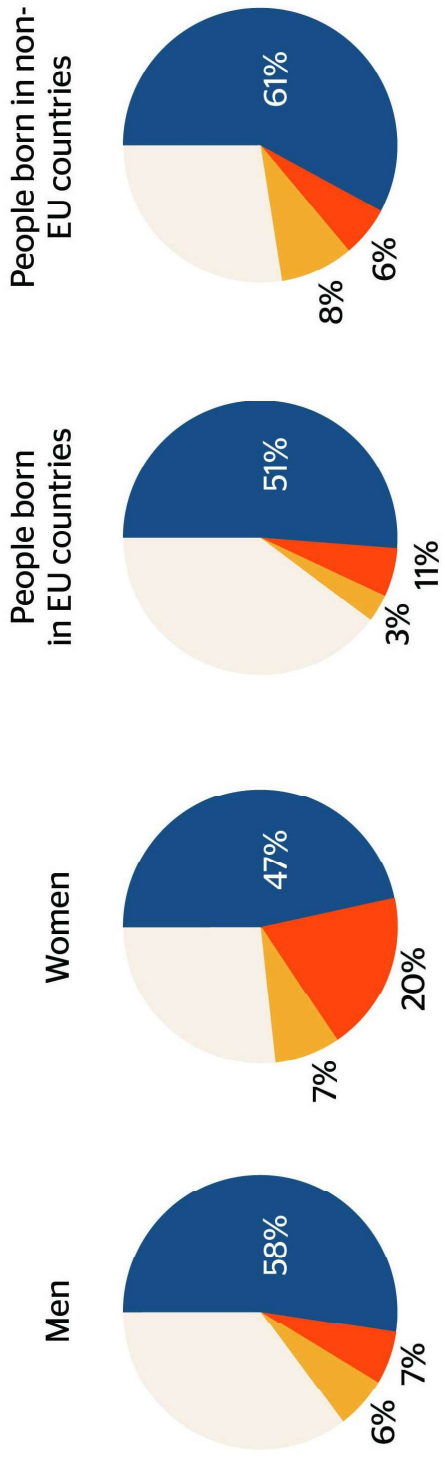
Age of the people living rough in Barcelona, by age range (2022) and on average (2016-2022)



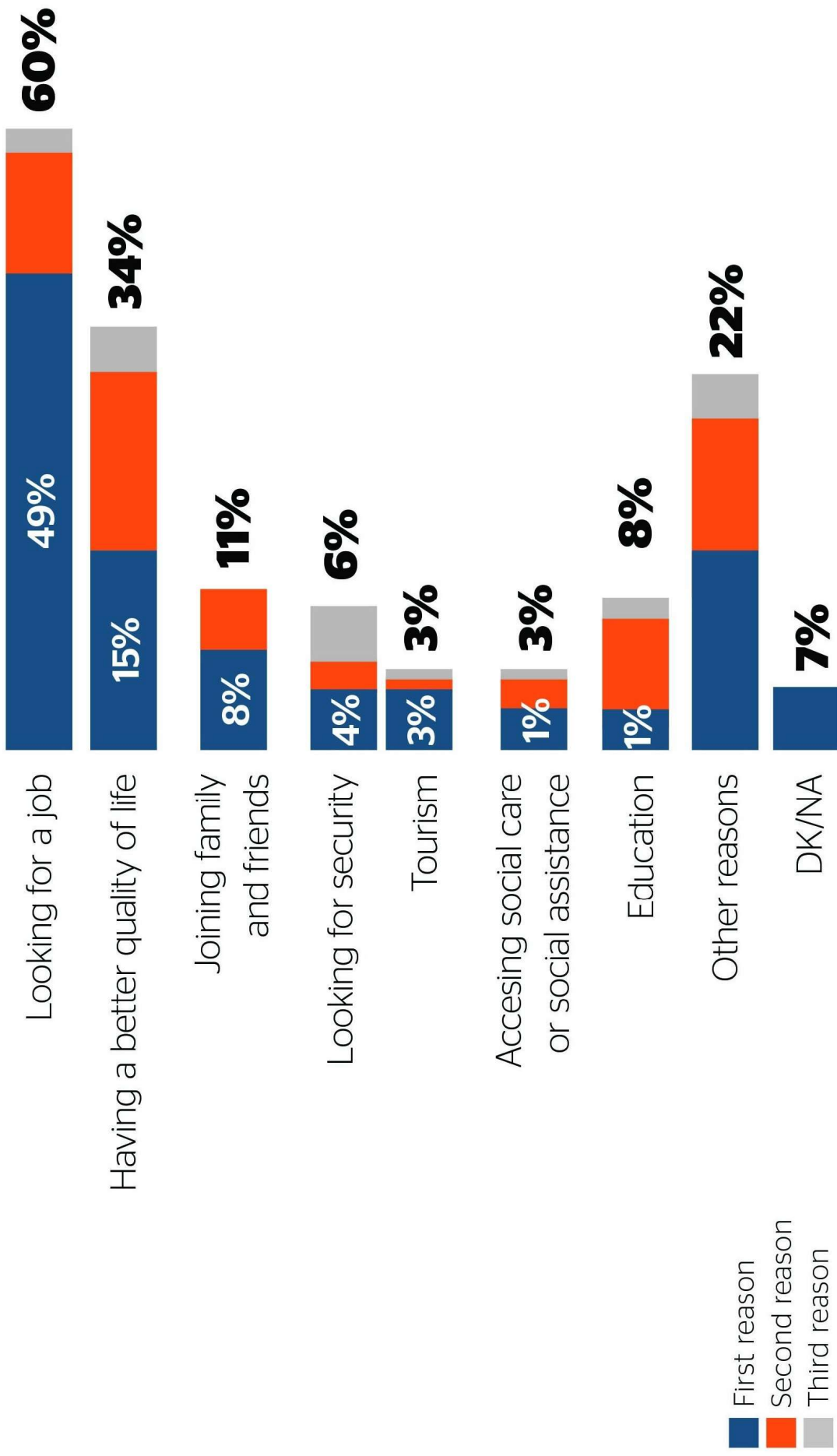
Place of birth of the people who live on the street in Barcelona (2016-2022)

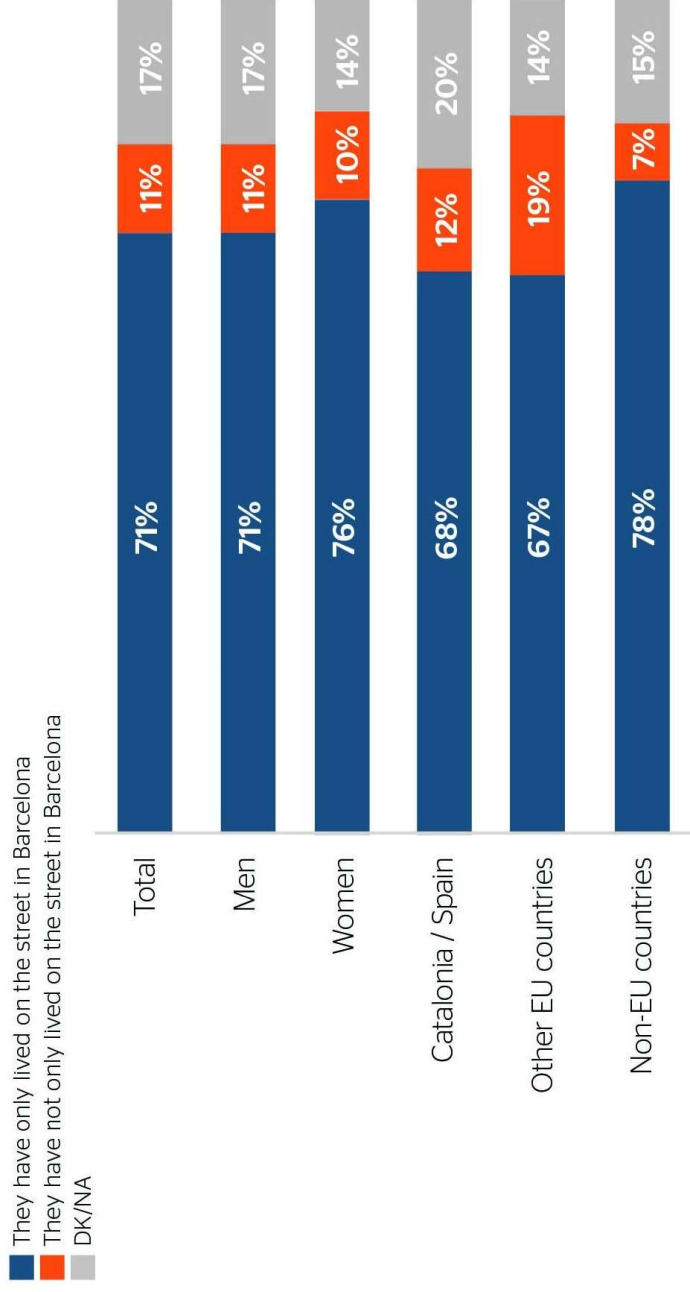

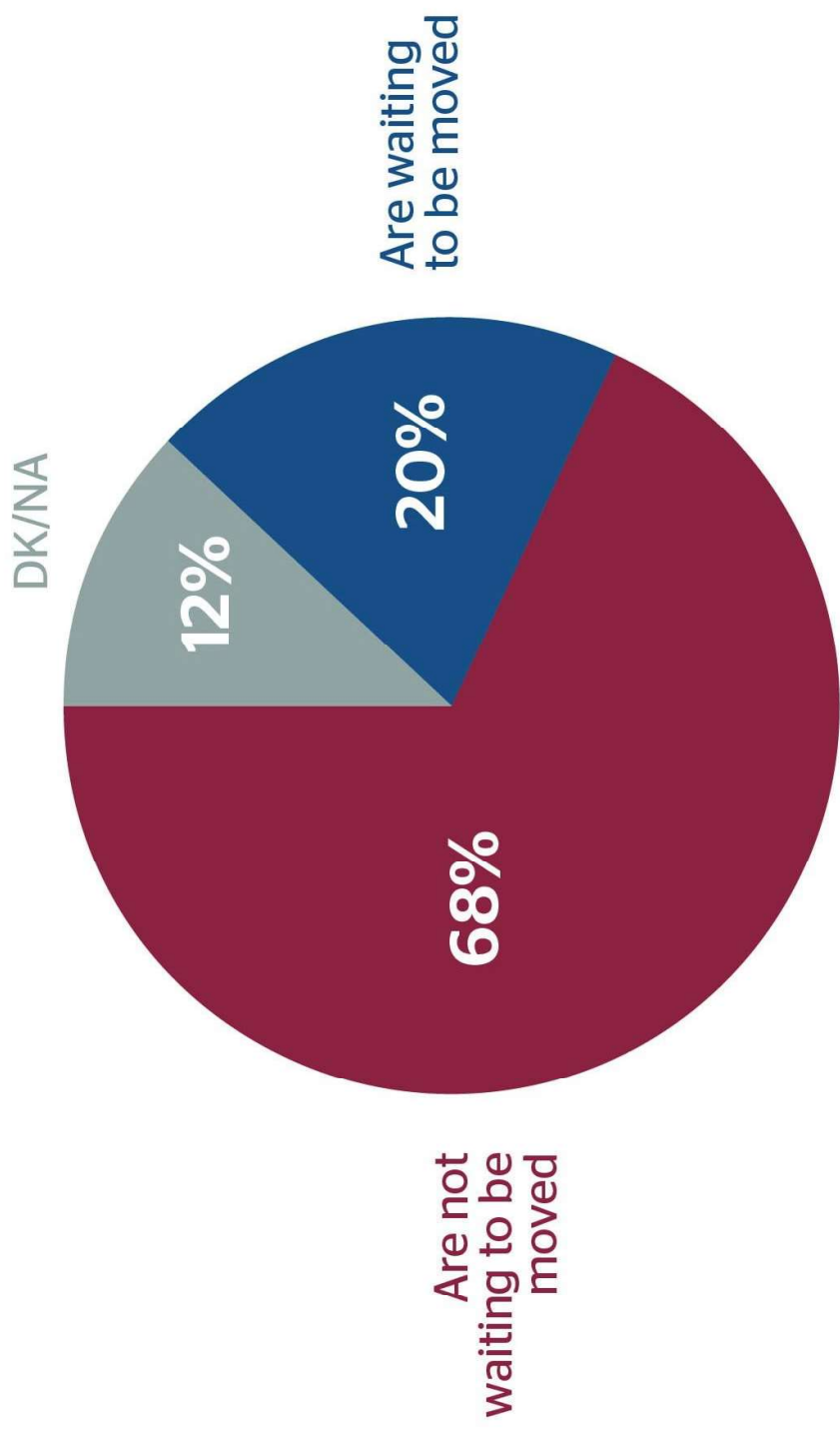


People living rough in Barcelona that only experienced homelessness in this city, by gender and place of birth (2022)

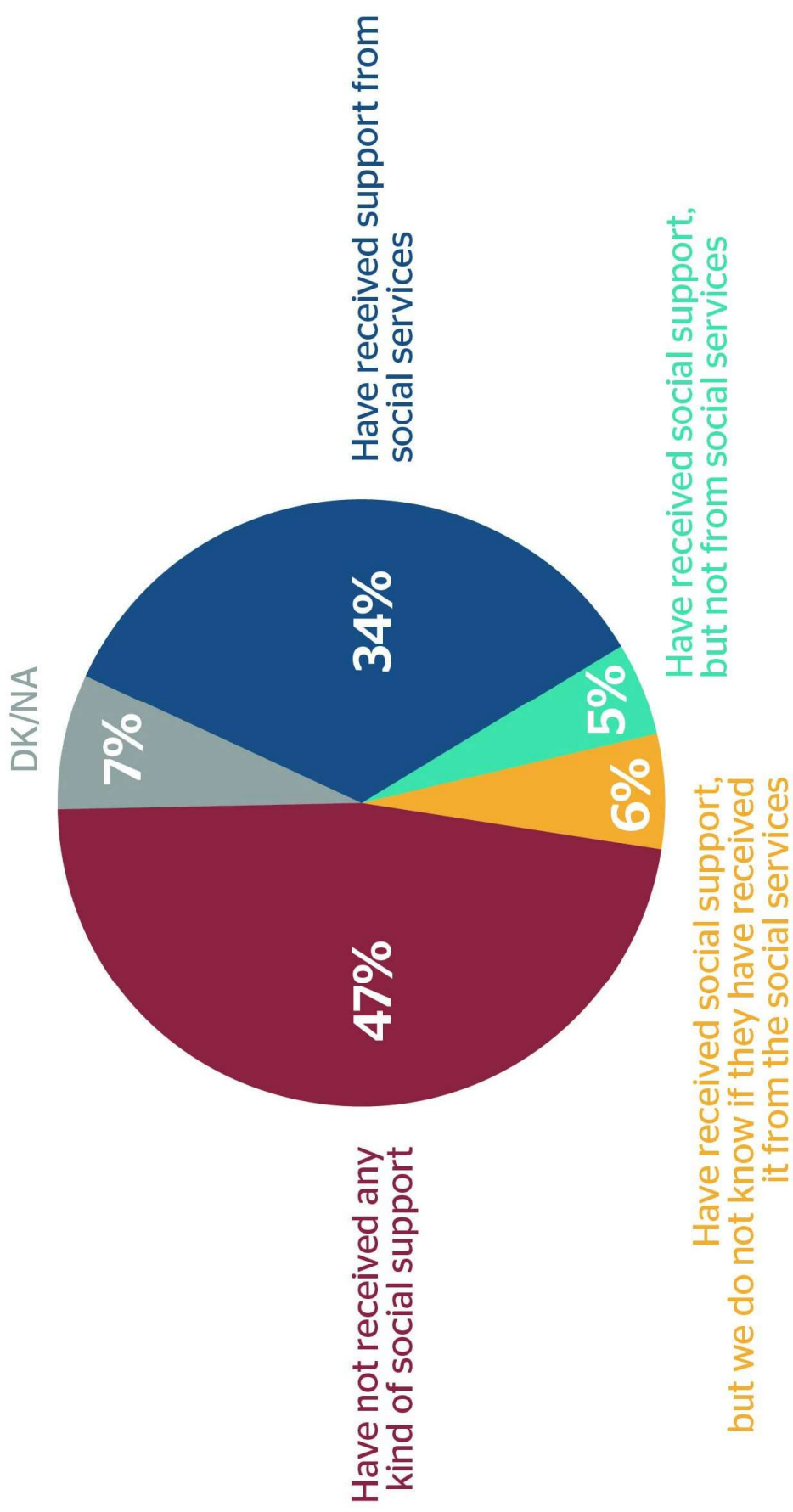




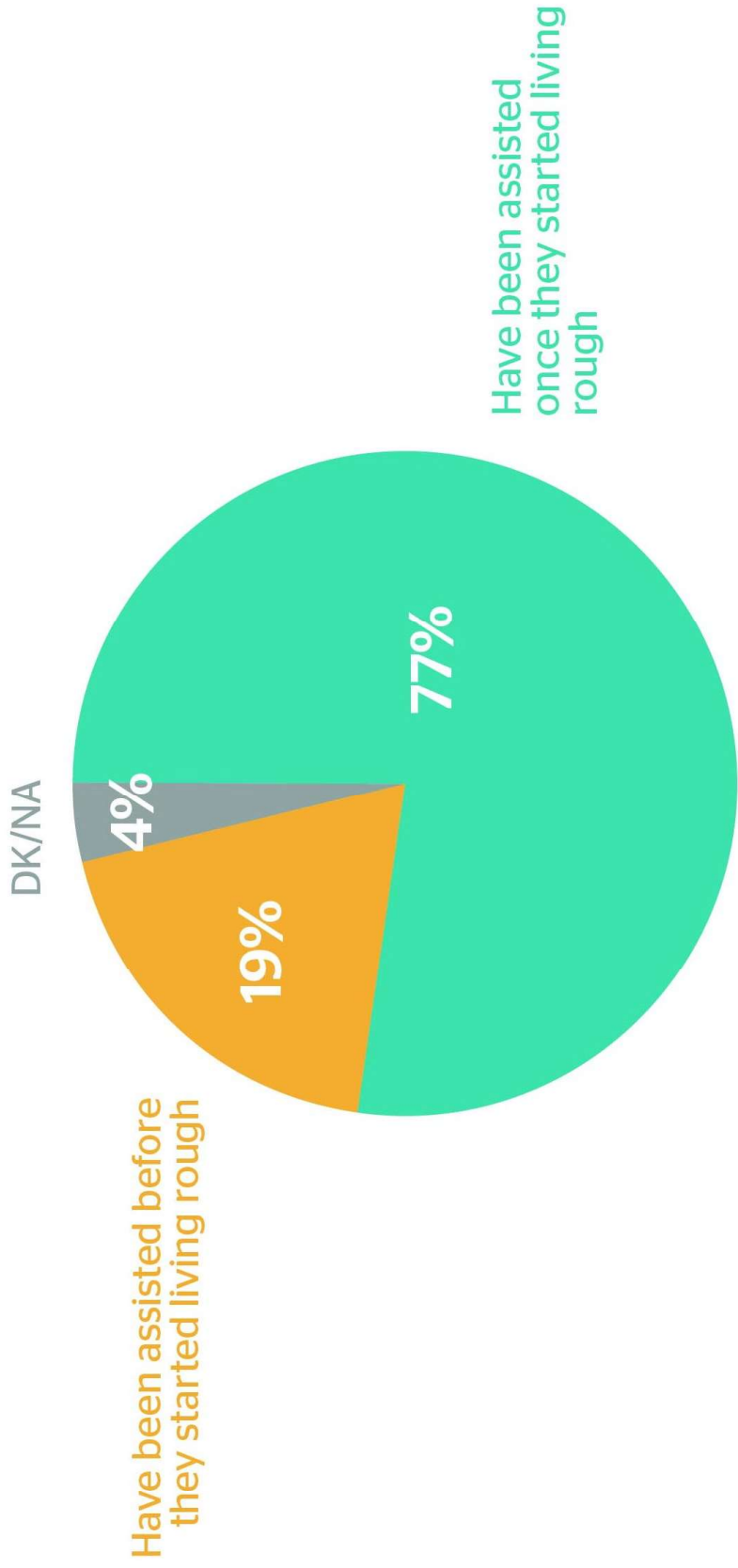
People living rough in Barcelona who consider themselves to be waiting to move into a housing or accommodation (2022)
